Using Technology to Improve On-Time Performance

AMTRAN doesn't invest in technology just for the sake of technology. We utilize technology to become more efficient and effective and to improve customer service.

For example, our myStop technology pushes real-time bus departures out to customers on the web, by phone, and through QR codes at each bus stop. Since many of our routes only run once an hour, it's very important to our customers to know whether the bus is on-time or running late.

Another convenient technology that we offer is trip planning through Google Maps. It's available on our website and through our smart phone app for iPhones and iPads.

Looking ahead, we are very excited

about what our technology can do for our customers next.

On-time Performance

Our next step is to use myStop to improve our on-time performance.

Over the next few months, we will be carefully examining each route and adjusting its timetable.



Our drivers will be utilizing the onboard technology that alerts them when they are running early or late. In our industry, traffic signals and congestion significantly impact ontime performance so it's hard to stay exactly on time. But the bus should never be early because then you might miss a customer.

As for running behind, we consider a bus late if it's more than 4 minutes behind schedule. That's about average for the public transportation industry.

Performance Goal

So our goal is never early and not more than 4 minutes late. By that standard, AMTRAN's current ontime performance is 75%. Our goal is to increase that figure to 85% over the next seven months.

We will let you know how we do in reaching that goal.

The <u>7:40 a.m.</u> trip on the #1 <u>Crosstown</u> (Walmart) will continue all summer.

The <u>8:00 a.m.</u> trip on the #3 <u>Flash</u> (Logan Town Centre) will continue all summer.

Beginning on June 23, the #1 <u>Crosstown</u> (Walmart) will have a 4:40 p.m. trip.

The #2 East End will add a 5:00 p.m. trip.

We are adding a <u>5:00 p.m.</u> trip to the #3 <u>Flash</u> (Logan Town Centre).

The last trip for route #4 <u>Plank Road</u> currently leaves downtown at 3:00 p.m. But beginning on June 23, we will add trips leaving the transit center at <u>4:00</u> and <u>5:00</u> <u>p.m.</u>

There will be a 5:20 p.m. trip added to the #5 Pleasant

<u>Valley</u> (Walmart) beginning June 23.

To help people get back home after taking care of Courthouse business, we are adding a #8 Hollidaysburg trip leaving downtown Altoona at 4:30 p.m. that will depart the Courthouse at 5:30 p.m.

Free Rides All Day

On June 19, AMTRAN in Altoona will be offering free rides all day on all buses on all routes.

Save money. Take the bus every day!

Sponsored by the American Public Transportation Association (APTA), the 2014 National Dump the Pump Day encourages people to ride public transportation and save money instead of driving a car. Started in June 2006 when gas prices first hit \$3 per gallon, this national day emphasizes that public transportation is a great travel option that also helps people save money. Saving money is on everyone's minds, and public transportation is the quickest way to beat high gas prices. According to the latest APTA Savings Report, individuals in a two-person household can save an average of \$842 monthly by downsizing to one car which translates to more than \$10,000 annually.

Transit Ridership at Record High

Last year, Americans took <u>10.7</u> <u>billion trips</u> on public transit. (That's billion with a "b.") That's the highest nationwide ridership in the <u>past 57 years</u>.

"Americans in growing numbers want to have more public transit services in their communities," said Peter Varga, APTA Chair.
